criteria nor in terms of advancing SNOW's Correctional Plan ahead of SRD in July 2020 (approximately 3 months away).

Notwithstanding, SNOW's behaviour at BI has not been problematic and there are no security intelligence issues in the case to preclude the absence. SNOW is assessed as a non-violent, 'Low' Risk to Public Safety and the London Area Parole Office are supportive of the UTA with a strategy in place for supervision (including Electronic Monitoring). Taking into account the COVID-19 pandemic, the Unescorted Temporary Absence as proposed would ensure continuity of medical treatment but in setting with family support and possibility of enhanced physical distancing.

With the imposition of the special conditions as outlined in the Assessment for Decision, risk for the duration of the UTA leading to Statutory Release is considered manageable.

MAI thus concurs with the CMT recommendation to AUTHORIZE the UTA.

FINAL DECISION

Rationale:

The Correctional Service of Canada, in recognition of the global novel coronavirus pandemic has undertaken extraordinary measures in an attempt to reduce the risk of the spread of this virus within our facilities. To address this risk, Bath Institution has modified routines to promote appropriate physical distancing, deployed enhanced cleaning measures, reduced the number of persons approved to access the site, conducted active screening of all persons entering the facility and provided health teaching to inmates and staff (i.e. hand hygiene and cough/sneeze into your elbow). As of the date this decision is written, Bath Institution does not have a suspected or confirmed case of Covid 19.

Mr. Snow brought forward a request to be approved for an unescorted temporary absence to his sisters' residence in London, Ontario. This application cited health concerns and cited risks associated with the novel coronavirus to himself within an institutional setting. It is recognised that in regular operational practice the unescorted temporary absence for medical reasons is a tool available to case management teams for consideration where the absence to a medical and/or treatment facility would be beneficial to the applicant. This decision took into consideration the health conditions of Mr. Snow combined with the potential for having a negative health outcome should he contract this virus.

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I concur with the MAI and case management team. I am approving the release of Mr. Snow given his specific health circumstances, the absence of violence in his criminal history and an appropriate supervision plan to address his risk and need areas combined with the increased ability to self isolate as per the public state of emergency related to the coronavirus pandemic.

The Unescorted Temporary Absence-Medical Reasons for offender Derrick SNOW to reside with his sister Crystal Pirie at [REDACTED] London, Ontario, N6B-2J7 until Statutory Release in July 2020 is hereby AUTHORIZED.

Release from custody is scheduled to occur Tuesday, April 21st. SNOW will be accompanied by CSC staff to the destination given the offender's medium security level, supervision history, medical needs and the difficulty in securing commercial transportation owing to the public health emergency and associated restrictions.

The following special conditions for this release are imposed as being the least restrictive, necessary and proportionate to assist in addressing his risk to the community and to assist in monitoring compliance related to the public health emergency and associated restrictions:

1. NOT TO CONSUME DRUGS: not to consume, purchase or possess drugs other than prescribed medication taken as prescribed and over the counter drugs taken as recommended by the manufacturer.
2. AVOID CERTAIN PERSONS: Not to associate with any person you know or have reason to believe is involved in criminal activity.
3. TAKE MEDS AS PRESCRIBED: Take prescribed medication as directed by a health care practitioner.
4. FOLLOW TREATMENT PLAN: Follow treatment plan / program to be arranged by your parole supervisor in the area of substance abuse.
5. OTHER; Meet with members of the mental health team to address, but not limited to, unresolved grief, childhood issues, depression and reintegration stressors.
6. REPORT RELATIONSHIPS: Immediately report all intimate sexual and non sexual relationships and friendships with females to your parole supervisor.
7. RESPECT CURFEW: Respect a curfew from 11pm to 7am except for medical-related reasons, or other reasons, authorized in advance by your parole supervisor. With a current rating of 'High' in both static and dynamic factors, along with a 'Low' Reintegration Potential, SNOW is assessed as an appropriate candidate for Electronic Monitoring to assist with compliance with the curfew. This special condition will also assist in monitoring compliance with the public health emergency in Ontario and associated restrictions.

It should be noted that physical and mental health considerations have been taken into account in this decision with no contraindications. Mr. Snow is not an Indigenous offender.

There are no victim considerations in this case.

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This decision may be appealed, within the Ontario Region via the inmate grievance procedure within thirty days of receipt of notification.
